



Endoxan Injection



Overview:

- *Endoxan is used in the treatment of various types of cancer. It can also be used in some diseases of the immune system, and to prevent rejection of organ transplants.*

Pre Procedure:

- CBC and RP1 blood tests have to be mandatorily done before the procedure.
- You must reveal all the medications that you are on currently to the doctor.
- Please inform the doctor if you have a cough, cold, fever, any infections or diarrhoea prior to the injection.
- You must have an early breakfast before the procedure.

• During Procedure:

- You are settled comfortably in an area where your privacy is respected throughout the procedure.

- You will be administered pre-medication half an hour before the injection to avoid acidity and vomiting.
- The infusion takes about 6 to 8 hours, which is a day care procedure and if you are stable after infusion, you will be sent home.

Post Procedure:

- Post procedure, you will also be administered antacid and antiemetics (to avoid acidity and nausea).
- You may resume normal daily activities, post procedure.
